TERMS OF REFERENCE Consultant for Business Development and Funding Workshop

1. INTRODUCTION

ChildFund Vietnam is the representative office of ChildFund Australia – an independent international development organisation that works to reduce poverty for children in developing communities.

ChildFund Australia is a member of the ChildFund Alliance – a global network of 11 organisations that assists almost 23 million children and their families in 70 countries. ChildFund Australia is a registered charity, a member of the Australian Council for International Development, and fully accredited by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade, which manages the Australian Government's overseas aid program.

ChildFund began working in Vietnam in 1995 and works in partnership to create community and systems change, which enables children and young people in vulnerable situations, to assert and realise their rights.

Projects are mainly implemented in the northern Provinces of Bac Kan, Cao Bang and Hoa Binh, where most people are from ethnic minority groups; often the most vulnerable and marginalised sections of the population. ChildFund Vietnam also implements nationwide projects that provide support to both formal and informal systems at national and provincial levels.

ChildFund Vietnam's projects focus on child rights and child protection, education, health, and wellbeing for children. ChildFund Vietnam prioritises building the resilience of young people, by giving them the opportunity to take part in sports, life skills learning, and supporting their participation in local decision-making processes.

2. BACKGROUND

In the strategic direction for 2022-2025, ChildFund Vietnam reiterates to work with our alliances to explore more opportunities of mutual interests, strengthening, and scaling up our work with women and families of the most vulnerable children, both in school and in the community, and areas that ChildFund Vietnam has not yet addressed.

To effectively secure a diverse source of funding and achieve our development objectives, it is important to streamline our pitching approach and implement a well-planned strategy. Additionally, we recognize the potential benefits of partnering with other peer NGOs to supplement our current track record of successful grants. As part of our efforts to enhance our institutional capacity, we aim to strength capacity in raising funds from grants and establish a system for responding to requests for proposals in a timely and efficient manner.

3. OBJECTIVES OF SERVICE

We are seeking a skilled consultant to enhance the effectiveness of our team in developing highquality proposals for a range of projects. The successful candidate will work closely with our Business Development Managers (BDM) to organize one-day workshop to share and discuss the best practices in response to a call for expression of interest/full proposal published by institutional donors (e.g GAC or UN) and unsolicited grant with corporates.

4. METHODOLOGY, TOOLS AND TASKS

The consultant is expected to review ChildFund's existing system and working mechanism between different internal departments (program, finance, HR and BD) in relation to the project development and Grant call application that will be briefed by BDM. A full-day workshop will be organized for a group of 20-25 key staff to share best practices in proposal development, followed by a Q&A section for further discussion. The following topics will be also covered in the workshop:

- Provide feedback on the current practice of ChildFund Vietnam.
- Provide hints and tips for specific donors, including but not limited to languages, compliance, and hot buttons and so on.
- Provide a brief update of some latest funding trends and suggest potential partners such as research institutes and CSOs

5. SCOPE OF WORK

Location

The workshop will be held in ChildFund Vietnam's offices in Ha Noi.

Time Frame (Scheduled activities)

It is anticipated the assignment will be undertaken in July, 2023.

- ✓ Strong writing, editing, and proofreading skills in English required, with excellent attention to detail.
